

- JC Asuncion and Abby Ducay, and many volunteers, quickly came together to make sure our hygiene/rest station, opened up on an emergency basis to make sure our guests had somewhere to go to the washroom and rest up, was always ready for action.
- Br. Dan Dionne has put his heart and soul into preparation of our music for our Tuesday to Friday 12:15 PM daily masses and our 11:30 AM Mass on Sunday. His other more than full time ministry lately, has been the design and implementation of our new A/V booth in the Sacris-

ty, which is necessary to house our very sensitive and expensive equipment to do livestreaming. We are so grateful for all you do Br. Dan. We've witnessed you coming alive!

- Christina Crawford, our Music Director, has recently returned from maternity leave and plays piano along with Br. Dan at the 11:30am Mass. Welcome back Christina!
- Without the technical skills of Ian Ford, we would not be where we are with livestreaming, have an updated and new look to our News from the Pews, or an updated website. Ian has worked many long volunteer hours behind the scenes in getting all of these projects done.
- Louella Lacerna has kept us all organized and safethrough this very disorganized and confusing time, making signs and posters, and making face masks.
- Diana Quildon has continued to stay in touch with our parishioners and volunteers.
- Rita Kara and Diane Downey, both banished from the office to work at home, continued on with their normal office duties, answering our phones and making sure things continued to run as if it were normal times.
- Arthur Kara came in on a daily basis to make sure our physical plant ran like a charm.
- Karen Ford came in to assure the continuation of our weekly News from the Pews.
- Fr. Jarek Pachocki, OMI, newly assigned as Vocation Direction for the Oblates, continues to work tirelessley, along with his new duties, to make sure Masses continue to be prepared for and our social media platforms are up to date by keeping everyone well informed.

De Mazenod Door Outreach The Poor • The Marginalized • The Inner-City Youth



A few weeks ago we wrote about the move of De Mazenod Door Outreach into the Pastoral Centre, and how we never realized that all the refrigeration units, stoves, coffee brewing machines and the body heat from staff and volunteers, would cause as much heat as it does. Because the heat was so oppressive, we had to keep the serving window open for several hours, and the refrigeration units were actually shutting down without fans blowing cold air on them all day and night. All inside doors needed to be open to circulate enough air to stop that from happening.

We reached out for help through News from the Pews, from anyone with a connection to an HVAC company, and not only did someone hear our plea, they responded in the most generous of ways.



The cost of the unit was donated by Mike and Debbie Peters, and the cost of installation was donated by Murray Peters Electric Ltd., with installation overseen by Chris Hixon. Both Mike and Debbie have been steadfast, dedicated volunteers and committed supporters of De Mazenod Door Outreach since day one. THIS IS AN URGENT REQUEST. Please see the list of duties we need teams for BEFORE AND AFTER EACH MASS:

SANCTUARY

- Wipe credence table
- Wipe all tables
- Wipe outside tabernacle
- Wipe presider chairs
- Wash floor
- Vestments should be washed after each Mass

NAVE

- Disinfect and wipe down all pews (front and back) including kneelers
- Disinfect all doors, light switches, tables, walls
- Mop floor
- Disinfect and wipe down all statues

SIDE ALTARS

 Musicians are responsible for cleaning and disinfecting all music equipment, microphones to be cleaned and sponged, mic protectors to be re-moved after each use and cleaned.

NARTHEX

- Disinfect all doors and handles
- Mop floors

BATHROOMS

 Clean and disinfect toilets, faucets and door handles after each use.

HAND SANITIZING AT THE ENTRANCE DOORS

Offer hand sanitizer to all coming in the church

All of the above functions MUST be performed after each Mass, which means x's 4 Masses. If you are able to help with these tasks, please phone the office - 905 522 9828, and let them know you are available.

MOVING FORWARD

Beginning this Wednesday, June 24, we will begin recalling some of our staff to our Administrative Centre. Rita Kara will be coming back to her office and Louella Lacerna will be coming back to the reception area. Arthur Kara comes back to his position as Facilities Operator.

Effective July 2, Diane Downey's hours will be restored to five days/week from four. Ian Ford and JC Asuncion will also be restored to their positions. Karen Ford and Diana Quildon will return shortly. Please also note:

- Baptisms private baptisms only (not during Mass at this time.)
- Masses Tuesday Friday will be public (up to 80 people) as well as livestreamed sign up not needed for weekday Masses
- Confessions are by appointment only

For visitors coming to our office, the following regulations are being implemented by the Diocese of Hamilton:

- Admittance to the office is by appointment only.
- All visitors must:
 - Sign the visitor's log
 - Attest they are not exhibiting any signs of Covid-19, and they have not been in contact with a Covid patient over the last 14 days.
 - Provide a contact phone number or email enabling communication of a Covid occurence at the office.
- If you feel unwell or your temperature is elevated, please do not come to our office
- Be sure to use hand sanitizer before entering the office
- Be sure to maintain a physical distance of 2 meters (6') at all times
- Wearing of a protective mask is mandatory.
