GOOD NEWS

"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." Acts 1:8

"He grew up in another obscure village.

He worked in a carpenter shop until he was thirty and then for three years was an itinerant preacher.

He never wrote a book.

He never held an office.

He never owned a home.

He never had a family.

He never went to college.

He never put his foot inside a big city.

He never traveled two hundred miles from the place where he was born.

He never did one of the things that usually accompany greatness.

He had no credentials but himself.

He had nothing to do with this world except the naked power of his divine manhood.

While still a young man the tide of popular opinion turned against him.

His friends ran away.

One of them denied him.

Another betrayed him.

He was turned over to his enemies.

He went through the mockery of a trial.

He was nailed upon the cross between two thieves.

His executioners gambled for the only piece of property he had on earth while he was

dving, and that was his coat.

When he was dead, he was taken down and laid in a borrowed grave through the pity of a friend.

Nineteen wide centuries have come and gone and today he is the centre of the human race and the leader of the column of progress.

I am far within the mark when I say that all the armies that ever marched, and all the navies that were ever built, and all the parliaments that ever sat and all the kings that ever reigned, put together, have not affected the life of man upon the earth as powerfully as has this one solitary life."

This is a reflection written by Dr. James Francis in the 1800's. It is a brief account of the life of Jesus Christ and the profound impact He has had on humanity and the world.

This Fourth Sunday of Advent, we wait patiently for the birth of our Saviour, when we light the Christ Candle on Christmas Eve. It is our reminder of the light that Jesus brings to the world and we celebrate the promise that Jesus' birth brings.



When we put into perspective the real purpose of Christmas, everything else takes a back seat. Even a global pandemic can not take away the love of God sending his own Son to save us from our sins.

The work of Jesus took place beyond the walls of any church. He called his apostles and us to do the same: to go to the ends of the earth and share the Good News.

WEEKLY VOCATION REFLECTION

GOD'S FAVOURED ONES

"Greetings, favoured one! The Lord is with you" Luke 1: 28



Wouldn't it be easy if we were all visited by an angel sent by God that would share with us the plan God had for our lives?

God may not have sent an angel to most of us; however, he does have a plan and he does share it with us. We are more like Mary than we think, in that we too must listen and then decide if we will answer God's call. One of the first things that the angel says to Mary is "Do not be afraid." This is interesting to me as there are really two things to be afraid of. The first is the obvious fear of being visited by an Angel; and the second thing to be afraid of was God's request.

This is where we can find our similarities with Mary, we are probably all afraid of what God is asking of us. So much so, we will even go out of our way to not listen to what God is leading us to. In today's culture, we are very used to believing that we are in control of our lives. We make plans about everything we do, which in itself isn't a problem. However, are we taking time to discern what we are being called to? I think often we are not, but the bigger question may be: do we actually go out of our way to ignore what God is trying to tell us? Is it a passive not hearing, or an active act of ignoring?

I'm not sure I believe that if we really want to hear what God is saying to us it would be that difficult. I don't think God wants it to be that hard to discern his plans. I think what likely makes it difficult is that it doesn't always go along with our own plans. Remember that Mary made

her decision for the whole world, for her community. Is this what makes us hesitate? It is definitely harder to decide something when it is for the greater good, rather than what is best for our selves. Yet, this is exactly what we are called to do as Christians and followers of Jesus.

I believe we often don't understand that by doing what is best for our community, we will make the best decision for ourselves. This is how we will be most fulfilled: by using our gifts and talents to serve our brother and sisters. I truly believe we are all God's favoured ones, maybe not in the way that Mary was – in that she was asked to carry the Son of God – but favored in how he loves us unconditionally. And so, my hope is that we can quit ignoring what we are called to, and that we take the time to hear what is being asking of us so that we can find our vocation and say yes to God.

ADVENT AT HOME



4th SUNDAY OF ADVENT

The Christ child lay in a manger with choirs of Angels singing. Glory shone all around. Mary's eyes gleamed with love and tenderness – she knew that her child would bring eternal love to the world.

With the first three candles burning, light the last purple candle from their flame as your family prays:

R1. O God, we light the fourth candle of Advent.

R2. We hear your angel Gabriel and witness the faith of Mary. Fill us with your grace and light.

R1 & R2. We recall the times we have struggled but said yes. We know times when God has filled us and our world with blessings. We remember....(a family member OR describe a time of great joy, when although it may have begun in struggles, God filled the situation with hope, love or peace).

R1. Mary was a young, strong spiritual woman. Even through gloom of night. Bear though her life was not easy, she heard God's voice and Come to us, O Christ the Light.

said "yes". Her song was a prayer that would uplift those who were downtrodden. Her lyrics shattered the proud and called the world to change. She would bear within her the promised child, Jesus the "Light of the World". This Advent, we respond to God's beckoning to us as well.

Together: Revealing God, visit us, fill us with your Spirit. bring good news to life within us. Give us the courage to carry your light into the shadows and injustices of the world. Amen.

Together: Shine on us, O God of Justice, guide our path through gloom of night. Bear within us Wisdom's glory, Come to us, O Christ the Light.

CHRISTMAS EVE OR CHRISTMAS MORNING

This is the end of our Advent journey this year, but the end of Advent always marks the beginning of our Catholic life. Let us rely on Jesus who came to save us.

R1: Rejoice, people of God! The light has come into the world. (A family member light the four Advent candles). O God now we light the candle of your Nativity. (With the four Advent candles burning, a family member lights the centre white candle).

R2: With the company of heaven and with the sounds of great joy, you come to us. This is a time of light and of resplendent joy. We have known times when God has come and brought life and light to our world.

God has been born among us. We remember.. (a family member describes a time, at Christmas or otherwise, when God has been joyfully present or powerfully revealed to our family, church, community or world).

R1: The prophet Isaiah proclaimed a time when those who walked in the shadows would see a great light. "A light

would shine; and a child will be born to us". The Evangelist Luke painted the Nativity sky and repeated the heavenly song of the angels, "Glory in the highest, peace on earth and goodwill to men" John declared that this great light is Christ, the Word made flesh. This great light lives among us. By this light we behold God's glory, full of grace and truth. At Christ's nativity, we now rejoice.

Together: God of Light and Life, thank you for coming among us this night/day. Thank you for touching all of heaven and earth with your splendor. In every corner of the world, shine on the night /day with your grace. Amen. Together: Shine on us, O God of Justice, guide our path through gloom of night, bear within us Wisdom's glory; Come to us, O Christ the Light. Glory be to God and peace on earth. Christ the light is born a child.

AMMENDMENTS TO MAID LEGISLATION

MAID: Medical Assistance in Dying



The Minister of Health David Lametti accused those who wouldn't support Bill C-7 in the legislature of representing the "religious right". What a sad day for Canadians that those who oppose euthanasia are dismissed in this way! There are tens of thousands of individual Canadians who have written in opposition of euthanasia through the Coalition for HealthCARE and Conscience website since 2015. These are not the voices of a fringe group, but the voices of concerned Canadians who care for the vulnerable.

While Parliament has passed Bill C-7, it still needs to be passed by the Senate before it becomes law. The debate continues this week in the

Senate around this bill. NOW is the time to send them the message that Canadians don't want this Bill passed and that we don't want them to further endanger the lives of the vulnerable!

A Canadian Psychiatrist shared with us his concerns about the news that a number of Senators are seriously considering amending the draft legislation to allow people with mental illnesses to be euthanized. Mental illness was specifically excluded in the draft legislation, but we fear the calls to remove this exclusion will be successful, unless Canadians speak up.
