LOVE BEYOND THE WALLS

Love can be characterized by many things but perhaps the greatest is "self-lessness".

The helplessness of a newborn baby soon sheds away any selfishness we may hang onto because that baby is 100% dependent on the love and care that we give him or her. Although we are still a week away from Christmas, love is the theme that leads us through the 4th week of advent. We have been preparing ourselves throughout the four weeks of advent with the themes of Hope, Peace, Joy and now Love; we will need all of these themes to see us through the Christmas season to the Epiphany. Perhaps we can even add a few more virtues that would support the meaning of Advent.

Prepare is an important one in many ways because if we are unprepared, we may miss the impact of the incarnation. Christ, God's Son, enters into the world. How would we prepare for that? Peace is something we can certainly benefit from more of. There is a kind of peace that is deeper than any peace we have known. It surpasses all understanding and refreshes the soul. Listen to the voice of God who speaks below the noise of the crowded spaces we visit. One quiet voice can lead us in a direction that would truly be a blessing for us. Give a gift of time or something that really has the receiver in mind. Remember that not all profound gifts come from wealth. Think of the gift children are to us and remember, they have very little. Being creative is key in the way we invest in each other. Expressing ourselves in new ways says that they were worth the time it took to prepare for.

Love has an eloquent meaning - articulate and strong in its ability to clearly express itself. It crosses many bridges that may have previously been considered "Burnt" or uncrossable. Without a doubt, love will go though many barriers and is a necessary ingredient for healing. Many love relationships between couples and even friends take on a special meaning because it will connect people where there was once little connection. The opportunity to form meaningful bonds is perhaps the thing most sought out by people everywhere. If I could think of a thing that is opposite of this it would be loneliness. We all know or have an idea how many people suffer loneliness

today. Perhaps if we could pledge ourselves to one thing, it could be, reaching out to someone who seems lonely.

Christmas cheer is great. Wouldn't it be better still if we included someone that felt left out? Remember, if someone doesn't have a smile; give them yours. Don't worry, it will grow back right away. If that's all it takes to start, just think what could happen if our heart got involved and then had an effect on other people? I want to wish you a great Advent preparation for a wonderful Christmas season. Once Jesus comes, we will need all the creativity and eloquence we can gather in order to speak of the King of Love.






VOCATIONS REFLECTION

THE STORY WE ARE MEANT TO HEAR

Elizabeth and Mary are both carrying their first children, Mary has gone to see Elizabeth so they can support each other; what an exciting time for both! These are the times in our lives that we feel very connected to our community, when things are going well, and we feel we can contribute and support each other. Everything comes easily, especially loving one another.



But both Mary and Elizabeth had likely recently gone through very difficult times of judgement in their communities; Elizabeth for being baren for so long and Mary for being with child out of wedlock. I know this isn't the usual story we think about when this passage is read, however, considering that Mary and Elizabeth were females during the 1st century in the Mediterranean, this is exactly what it would have meant for them. It would have been a very difficult time for Mary especially, who would have pushed to the margins of society. It's times like this when it feels as if the world will come crashing down; the times we feel isolated and alone, maybe even shunned, that we need each other. It is during those times that it is so important

to have people to be in solidarity with. Mary would have felt lost and abandoned. This is the real reason that Mary went to see Elizabeth, this is the story we are meant to hear.

Now, during Advent as we are waiting for Jesus to come and redeem us, I believe this is the message we are called to reflect on. Where are the lost and abandoned in our community; it's likely we don't have to look very far. Yet we must look, we just can't do life alone. It's too difficult; and even though we may be following the path that has been prepared for us, it doesn't mean that we won't need help along the way. We are called to be there for each other, in community; to support one another, to care for all, to love each other when that doesn't seem possible. Community is the only place we can find the help we may need, as well as the help we are meant to give. We will find it in the people that have gone through something similar, in the people that have gone through something totally different, in the people that haven't struggled much at all, and in the people that need us. It takes all of us together, in all our uniqueness. This is where we will become everything God wants us to be, in the messiness of life, on the margins; where we can share everything we have and receive everything that we need.
