

CONSPIRACY: FOR OR AGAINST?

We hear the word "conspiracy" in which it describes a separating of people at a distance from each other and defaming those who oppose a narrow point of view. This is the opposite of what Christ came to show us. Where did we learn such a behavior? Somewhere along the way we have lost our way and have given in to un-truths and opinions stated as facts. We are so far from where we once were and it is hard to imagine how we arrived at such a rift. Too many times have we witnessed one against another or families at odds with each other. This is not the way to build anything that comes from a loving God. There is always a way to reconcile and to heal. We can come back together but it takes an unpretentious attitude. The conspiracy of the Holy Trinity, seeks to spread love and true understanding.

If there has ever been a plan for our own salvation, God will be the author. Many people try to ignore the fact that there is a higher reasoning that goes beyond our point of view. Many people also try to act out of whatever they desire in their lives, even if it goes against our better nature. To go beyond our limitations does not mean that we must always turn away from our human nature but we may have to turn away from some aspects of our nature if it is contaminated. There is not always a higher aspiration but we are all fallible and we need to be corrected from time to time.

Isolation, in the pandemic era, has caused many people to look at themselves for answers even though the truth is not confirmed. Self introspection is a good exercise though it is not necessarily right until we have a way to see if our real motivation comes from fact. Discernment has always pursued a conscious effort to improve ourselves so that we can become a beacon that points others to a real truth. It has never been about ourselves alone; it is about the way we see what is certifiable.



The most sought-after virtues, as seen in the holiest of saints, have been great goodness, humility, self sacrifice and generosity. We have, in us, the ability to move towards a holiness that lifts us up and removes divisions. If we seek out that truth living in us and separate it from what is profane in this world, we would be advancing our reasoning. I have discovered more of my limitations this way; It can be like a cleansing; I pray for a self awareness that brings us to live a fuller potential as people in connection with God and each other. Understanding the road signs that are pulling us in the wrong direction is a way of knowing that we can make better choices. The markers of peace and thoughtfulness can help guide us. The Conspiracy of the Holy Trinity has been designed for us specifically and so calls us to be the best possible version of ourselves.

VOCATIONS REFLECTION

"YOU GIVE THEM SOMETHING TO EAT" (LUKE 9: 23a)



When we reflect on the idea of vocation, our immediate response might be somewhat akin to that of the disciples in today's Gospel passage. Faced with the hungry crowd, their initial response was one of inadequacy. Their solution was for Jesus to send the crowd away so that the people could get lodging and provisions. Jesus' response was for the disciples simply to give everything they had, and it turned out to be enough.

As disciples, Jesus calls us to respond to the needs of our community, particularly of those whose lives cry out for freedom from oppression, poverty, racism and every other condition that prevents them from being fully the people God created them to be. Faced with the vastness of the task, we can either respond out of our feelings of inadequacy and turn away from the call, or we can hear Jesus' invitation to give everything we have and trust that it will be enough.

This willingness to give everything we have and trust that it will be enough is at the heart of understanding the meaning of vocation. God calls

each one of us in a general way as well as in a particular way. First of all, we are called into relationship with God and one another within the community of faith, gathered around the table of the Eucharist. This in our primary or general vocation. Within the vocation to be a disciple of Jesus, each one of us is also called to a particular vocation; married, single, religious, cleric, parent, teacher, mechanic, etc. No matter what our particular vocation, we are called to respond to the needs of others, to make Christ present in our world and continue to build the kingdom. Faced with the particular call from God, we are invited to trust that if we respond, if we give everything we have, it will be enough, and more than enough. God doesn't call us to the impossible, but to the possible, given the particular gifts and graces each of us has been given.

Reflecting on the gospel passage, perhaps the experience of feeding the crowd was what give the disciples the courage and faith to respond to their call to proclaim the Good News to the whole world. As we look to their example, we now are called to continue to proclaim and be the Good News to others.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK: HERE WE GROW AGAIN!

Dear friends, if you remember, just before the pandemic, three years ago, our church was given a major faceli; we repaired and reglazed our stain glass windows, painted the interior of the church, replaced the floor, repaired our pews and reorganized the interior of our church. We also installed a new entrance ramp to the front of our church.

The final two projects that were left outstanding were addressing the sound system and redoing the lighting of the interior of the church. This past year, working with a subcommittee and specialists in these professions, we came up with a plan that will greatly improve these two outstanding issues.

In the coming months, we will replace our sound system with the latest technology, which will improve the quality of sound up to 70%. The cost for this upgrade is \$150,000.00 plus tax. The lighting project will include lighting of our beautiful ceiling, the Stations of the Cross and a softer brighter lighting of the body of the church and sanctuary. This project is valued at \$280,000.00. This will complete our upgrades for our church interior, and I suspect, will see us well into the next 50 years of service of our beautiful church.

How will we finance these major expenses??? Lots of prayer!!! Trust that God will bless these projects and move the hearts of His faithful to be generous stewards as we attend to the stones that parishioners before us lovingly laid in place 145 years ago this coming August.

We already have set aside \$100,000.00 from our One Heart, One Soul Campaign. We have also put aside a further \$100,000.00 in our Heritage Account. We are well on our way! I appeal to parishioners and friends to help us continue to build our church together. I ask that you be as generous as you are able by donating to the Heritage Account. The church is for everyone - it is for all of us. Let us work together to build the church for us now, to honour the parishioners before, and to continue to inspire growth for future generations.
