## **COMPASSION**

Compassion... To empathize with someone who is suffering and to feel compelled to reduce their suffering. It is defined as the feeling that arises when you are confronted with another's suffering and feel motivated to relieve that suffering. To share in it. A sympathetic conscious concern for the sufferings or misfortunes of others and a desire to alleviate them.



Sometimes it seems that we have much greater difficulty practicing that same compassion when it comes to those that we spend our lives with, moreso than we do for strangers we don't even know. We hear and read about tragic stories or situations and we're easily moved or saddened. We've all thought that same thought 'what can we do to help' or 'what can we do to make the situation better'? We boldly talk about being good to the broken, but there are many who are broken within our midst - within our families, within our friendship circles, even within

our own walls. However, sometimes we don't seem to show that same level of compassion to those who are so close to us. It can be so easy to just let it be someone else's problem.

It shouldn't be so difficult to remember that compassion is rooted in love and if we truly love those who are struggling, then wouldn't we want to try harder to take on the pain of the person who is suffering? We must have the hope that some positive good will emerge from sharing in their suffering. If we truly love others as Christ loves us, then we need to see beyond what we WANT to see in people and meet them where they are at. To do that we need to be compassionate. We need to see each other with the same set of eyes that Jesus sees us, even the difficult ones. He loves us for who we are, because He is a compassionate God.

We can talk about it and we can preach about it until we're blue in the face, but if we aren't going to act upon it and sincerely do something to help, showing each other the love and compassion that Jesus says we are worthy of, then we need to stop talking and start looking within and start praying hard about it, asking ourselves why.

As good people, good Christians, good Catholics we should all feel and practice compassion. Not just thinking about it, but getting in the muck of it.

Compassion is the greatest form of love that humans have to offer.

## **VOCATIONS REFLECTION**

### I WILL FOLLOW YOU... BUT

"No one who puts a hand to the plow and looks back is fit for the kingdom of God." Luke 9:62

Discerning our vocation can be a challenging task. When we focus on listening for God's call in our lives, we have to step out of our "comfort zone" and stop giving excuses – which is not easy... Today's Gospel story presents to us the tension between the call and the wholehearted answer: "I will follow you, but...". There are many factors that can hold us back such as fear, uncertainty, uncomfortableness of letting go or simply a lack of a clear vision and direction. Even the saints struggled with this!

In his early twenties, young Eugene de Mazenod experienced a significant internal crisis. We could say he "hit the wall". It seems like everything that he intended to do in order to bring some peace and stability into his life was falling apart. He deeply missed his father and uncles, who remained in Palermo, while he returned to Aix. At the same time the atmosphere within the Joannis family "suffocated" him. After failing a couple of opportunities for marriage, he had no other prospects at hand. The unsuccessful trip to Paris, where he hoped to obtain a passport, crushed all his dreams about a military career and a splendid life of nobility in Sicily. This time of crisis, disappointment and lack of direction was an opening for a moment of grace from God to fill the emptiness of Eugene's life.



The experience of Good Friday was a breakthrough when his heart's deepest desires were fulfilled. Eugene had a personal encounter with God, who is very real. This was the moment when Eugene was called to let go his own ideas of a "comfort zone" and enter into the uncertainty with trust. "Foxes have holes, and birds of the air have nests; but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head... Follow me." (Luke 9:58-59). Unlike the men from today's Gospel, Eugene answered the call. He turned from being self-focused into God-focused, and his life became an oblation to God and His calling. This refocusing of Eugene's life is confirmed by the conscious decision he made and that was followed by a strong commitment to make God a priority from that day forward. "What more glorious occupation than to act in everything and for everything only for God, to love him above all else, to love him all the more as one who has loved him too late." (Retreat Notes, December 1814)

Our vocation can only be fulfilled if we have the courage to answer the call. Maybe today you hear a call from God to a particular way of life, to make a change, to do something more. Maybe today Jesus says to you, "Follow me." Have the courage to answer the call!

# PASTORAL EMERGENCY CALLS AT HAMILTON HEALTH SCIENCES

Effective June 29, a new system for contacting a Catholic Priest to attend the dying for each HHS site comes into effect. HHS switchboard will no longer contact the Priest on-call in case of pastoral urgency at General, McMaster or Juravinski Hospitals. Instead, a self-governed call-forwarding system has been established by the Hamilton Deanery. Each HHS site will have a telephone number that can be accessed through the nurses' station and used by Hospital staff, or patient families, to call for a Priest to offer the Anointing for the sick and dying in urgent need. For all other spiritual needs while in hospital – counselling, reception of Holy Communion, or other needs please contact your own Parish. NOTE: this change does not impact Saint Joseph Hospital. It's always a good idea to let the Parish know if you anticipate a hospital stay so that arrangements can be made for a pastoral visit.



THE VATICAN HAS CONFIRMED the program of the Papal Visit to Canada, July 24-29, 2022! The Holy Father will travel within Alberta (based in Edmonton) from July 24-27, followed by a visit to Quebec City and Ste. Anne-de-Beaupre, July 27-29. Pope Francis

will visit Iqaluit, Nunavut, the afternoon of July 29th, before returning to Rome. Drawing on the theme, "Walking Together", the Holy Father's journey of reconciliation, healing and hope includes visits to a former residential school, Indigenous pilgrimage sites, two public Masses and mix of public and private events. Free tickets will be available for a limited number of events, all of which will be broadcast and accessible via livestream. # VOLUNTEER CORNER

This is the last installment of this series on the many different ministries that you can be involved in here at the parish. Although this series comes to an end, the need for volunteers does not. Please consider getting involved!

#### DE MAZENOD OUTREACH

This is a 24/7 x 365 Program. Jesus said to His disciples "You give them something to eat."

The Guests at the Door need to eat every day. The "Door" serves breakfast from Sunday to Thursday betwee 10:00 - 11:00 AM. Lunch is served on those day between 11:00 AM - 1:00 PM. On Fridays, breakfast is 10:00 -11:00 AM and the BBQ is from 12:45 PM - 2:30 PM. At these BBQs, there is lively music and there are other good available for free. This busy ministry is in need of volunteers daily.

To volunteer at the Door, you must be able to function within a team & fast paced environment. Being able to follow instructions, do menial tasks, stand for fairly long periods of time are also expected. As a volunteer you must be polite to other volunteers and staff, but especially to the guests who come to the Door for a meal and some non-judgmental human contact.

All volunteers at the Door must be 18-years and older and must provide a Criminal Records & Judicial Matters police check screening. In addition, the contact information of 3 non-family members are required for a Reference Check. This is to follow Diocesan mandated rules, but also for everyone's safety.

Detailed training (i.e. safe food handling) will be given, as well as hands on training to participate in this ministry. De Mazenod Farm is a part of this Ministry and many of the same requirments apply.

Previously mentioned ministires inclide: youth ministry, altar serving, WrapAround, wedding ministry, funeral ministry, maintenance, live streaming,
