


VOCATIONS REFLECTION IF I ONLY LISTEN

"Abraham replied, 'They have Moses and the prophets; they should listen to them." Luke 16:29

As we listen to the Gospel this weekend, we can hear that unspoken painful regret, "If only I had listened." The rich man hadn't listened to Moses and the prophets, and ended up being separated from God, "suffering torment in these flames". It's too late for him; but certainly, it's not too late for us. If we only listen!

A few years ago, I ran a race, the "Fast and Furriest 5K" with my dog Sutton, a joyful running companion for many years. Sutton absolutely loved running! Running a race had always brought out his competitive nature. He was going to win that race! However, he didn't realize that being an older dog, running in relatively warm weather, that he should take it easy. Half way through the race, Sutton started showing some signs of exhaustion. He began slowing down and eventually he collapsed on the sidelines of the route. We still had one kilometer or so to go; so, I thought I would carry him through the finish line in my arms. What a 'heroic story' that would be to tell! Thankfully, someone else was watching us from the side and had more sense than I did. The poor dog needed to cool down. He was overheated with the signs of a heatstroke. We laid him in the shade under a tree and poured cold water over him. That saved his life.

If I had listened to my ego-filled heroic thoughts, most likely I would have lost him that day. Can you imagine the pain of a broken heart, laden with the guilt of stupidity on my part? I'm so grateful I listened to the voice of a stranger on the sidewalk. His was the humble and caring voice of reason. It would have been so difficult to bear the pain of not listening. 'If I only have listened.' Sutton never regained the same level of fitness after this inci-



dent, but he continued to enjoy shorter and slower runs. He died a few years later of old age.

Listening is an essential part of discernment. We need to listen when making decisions, when embracing the purpose and meaning of our lives and when discerning our own vocation. God speaks to us in many ways. Sometimes it happens in a silent prayer, or when reading Scripture or through insight that we've never had before. Sometimes God speaks to us through events, or circumstances or encounters that we experience in our daily lives.

Sometimes the voice of God can be heard through a spiritual director, a trusted friend or even a stranger. All we have to do, is to LISTEN and we'll hear it.

BEYOND THE WALLS

What Happens Here Doesn't Stay Here

How important is support? It's crucially and critically important!

In the midst of all that is happening here at both the Parish and at the De Mazenod Door Outreach ministries, one cannot even fathom how we could do all that we do without a good support system. As important as support is in respect to the financial support we need and rely on, it's about the kind of support that comes in the form of encouragement and reassurance.

Studies have shown that having a strong support system has great positive benefits. Advantages such as higher levels of well-being, better coping skills, good health and longevity. Research has also shown that social support can reduce anxiety and depression. A strong support system can often assist with the reduction of stress.

There is an abundance of ways to show support. Assisting someone with normal everyday tasks when they aren't feeling well or offering some financial assistance when they are in need. By offering advice to a friend when they are facing a difficult situation or trying to make a challenging decision. Sometimes just by providing caring, empathy, and concern for your loved ones in need is a huge support.

Just as importantly, emotional support in dealing with life's difficulties is vitally significant. Both personal and work related pressures have been associated with a wide variety of health problems that include high blood pressure, mental health vulnerability, cardiovascular disease and cognitive decline.

How important is support? It's crucially and critically important.

Listening to someone vent or being there for someone when they need an ear or a shoulder is simply human kindness and it's really fundamental to their well-being. How many times have you felt better simply because you got something off of your chest or shared a burden that seemed just to heavy for you to carry alone?

When we ask someone 'how are you' or 'how are things', are we really prepared to listen to their answer? Or are we just hoping to hear 'l'm fine'? If you care enough to ask the question, you should be prepared to listen to the answer with a compassionate ear.

Having faith in God is supportive as well. Faith in God helps us receive both spiritual and physical healing. During troubling times and times of conflict or discord, our faith can give us the strength we need to press forward as well as the ability to face our hardships with courage. Like, shoring us up.

Whatever the reason is that you're the one needing support, be sure to reach out to someone. If not for some tangible assistance that a friend or family or work teammate can help with, then for that listening ear. When the burden gets too heavy, consider asking Jesus to help carry that weight. Prayer can be fundamentally healing in itself.


