BEYOND THE WALLS



It's so hard to fathom that it's already been almost eight years since I received an invitation to volunteer here at St. Patrick's. Actually, it was to help out with a Friday BBQ at De Mazenod Door. Back then, in it's humble beginnings, the weekly BBQ was on - what seems now to be - a much smaller scale. At the time, it seemed to be crazy busy. I was 'needed', Sherri said!

I remember how cold it was that Friday. I donned my parka, ready to serve the many guests of the De Mazenod Door who had lined up outside for what is still the favourite day of the week. That cold winter day led to another, and then another, and before I knew it I was a regular, volunteering with other ministries, like the Administrative Office, helping fold bulletins and serving at the big sit-down dinners on special occasions. And then De Mazenod Door Outreach truly called my name.

That first Friday BBQ experience didn't end on that Friday. I now know that it wasn't the only intention, but rather a sign from God that there was more in store for me. After a 25 year hiatus away from the Church, suddenly I was back in the pews whenever I was on site and on the weekend, listening with new ears and hearing what I truly had never heard before. Maybe for the very first time in my life I was listening with my heart. Not just hearing, but really listening.

My own personal growth has been an amazing journey and I sincerely believe that credit needs to be given to my time spent here. It continues to brighten my path every day helping me to become more and more confident each day. I am a quiet, almost introverted woman. Coming out of my shell has taken work, but has been so much easier because of the 'come as you are' attitude that St. Patrick's is known for. They took me as I was and still take me today, as I am. I didn't need to be molded into someone I wasn't. It's okay that I am me!

Now, all of these years later, there are more and more opportunities and ministries for others like me who just need a push - or a pull. That invitation to come to help out and lend a hand added more to my life than I ever thought possible. Certainly more than I ever expected.

What started as one day for me became a career. Somewhere that I wanted to call my home away from home, at least 5 days a week. I couldn't imagine this not being my life. I'm forever grateful for that phone call 8 years ago, for that extended hand. I'm grateful every day that I put my faith into action - and my actions into faith.

VOCATION REFLECTION

PEACE BE WITH YOU

I still find it hard to wrap my head around all the ways in which God has made each of us so different. While our differences can be exhilarating, it can also be challenging to deal with others' differences; wouldn't things be much easier if we all thought the same? What if we all had the same political views or even religious views? I mean, it may not be very interesting, but at least we would be able to agree. Everything in our world seems so divided; a Provincial election here in Alberta can attest to that. It is so easy to hurt one another because of our differences. Knowing that God could have created us to be more alike to avoid all the uncomfortableness but didn't should tell us something. In the First Reading on Sunday, the story is about the tongues that came and rested on each of the disciples. Isn't this interesting; the Holy Spirit could have rested on the ears of humankind and had everyone understand the same language yet choose to work with the diversity already in place.

I believe fully, as with all things of God, that it was intentional. Again, what is this supposed to tell us? I think that God is trying to tell us that not only does our strength lie in being in community, but that we are at our best when we embrace our individuality and all our differences. We need to have struggles in order to get the best outcome. In John's Gospel account, Jesus actually prepares us for it. He shares peace with the disciples and then instructs them to go and do the same. He then speaks to forgiveness; why would he do that? Because God knows how difficult it is to be ourselves, use our unique gifts and talents, and be different; however, it is also necessary. As we try to understand each other's perspectives, like trying to understand a new language, we may not always get it right. We will misunderstand, we may misinterpret, and another person's words may not translate as intended. And so Jesus reminds the disciples and us to forgive each other and to share peace, even with those that mean us harm. Being a Christian isn't easy; it is not for the faint of heart. We must share peace, not just by shaking hands at mass, but by creating an atmosphere of welcome, mercy and love. We will hurt each other as we try to live in community, and we will need to forgive each other. However, we must remember that this is necessary. We are called to be different; this is how we will be the best community we can be.

FROM THE DIOCESE



Let us return with Joy!

May 24, 2023

Dear Friends:

For the past three years, the world has been shaken by the Covid-19 virus, and our lives have been changed as we sought to observe the many protocols which were established for our health and safety. These included frequent periods when we were unable to come together to celebrate our faith and be nourished by the Sacraments. On several occasions our churches were closed, and we were unable to celebrate the Sunday Eucharist, which is so fundamental to our Catholic way of life.

Since we foresaw occasions when we would be prevented from participating in Sunday Mass, and we were fearful of gathering as long as Covid-19 and its variants were spreading and threatening the health of so many people, on March 16, 2020, I dispensed the faithful of our Diocese from the obligation to participate in the Sunday Eucharist.

During the pandemic, several Parishes in our Diocese provided livestreaming, so that even though parishioners could not be physically present and participate fully in the Sunday Mass, they were able to at least hear the Word of God proclaimed and witness the celebration of Mass broadcast from their Parish. I am grateful for all the ways that our Priests sought to provide spiritual support to their parishioners during those difficult years!

In recent months, we have been able to resume most of our former activities. It has been a great joy to gather again with our families and friends, and especially with our Parish communities. At the beginning of this month, the World Health Organization declared that the Covid-19 virus is an on-going health issue; however, it no longer constitutes a public health emergency of international concern. Furthermore, all Covid-related restrictions have been removed in our Province. For this reason, I am removing the dispensation from the obligation to participate at Sunday Mass, effective on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi), June 11, 2023.

I understand that some members of the faithful, for reasons of health, may not feel able to return to Mass. However, it has always been the teaching of the Church, that those who are impeded from participating at Sunday Mass because of ill health, or care for the sick, or some other grave reason, are not bound by the obligation to participate in the Sunday Eucharist. Those who are now able to resume their regular activities and enjoy good health are obliged to participate at Sunday Mass. "Virtual Masses" online and on television, while spiritually helpful, do not fulfill the Sunday obligation for those who are able to attend Mass in person.

Today, on this Solemnity of Pentecost, we mark the conclusion of the Easter Season and celebrate the birthday of the Church. From the earliest days of the Church, Christians have come together on Sunday, the Lord's Day, to celebrate the Eucharist. And so, I take this opportunity to invite all the faithful of our Diocese, if they have not already done so, to return with joy to the Sunday Mass.

May our faithful celebration of the Sunday Eucharist and our reception of the Body and Blood of our Risen Lord Jesus Christ in Holy Communion never cease to nourish our faith and strengthen us to be missionary disciples.
